Thank you for your generous donation of Cowboy Action Shooting demonstrations in support of M.U.L.E.Y. Kids' Day. M.U.L.E.Y. (Mindful, Understanding, Legal and Ethical Youth) is a Mule Deer Foundation (MDF) shooting sport and wildlife conservation program oriented to youth. The event was highly successful as the result of the hard work of over 50 volunteers from Colorado Shaketails and numerous wildlife conservation organizations.

Almost 300 guests to include 174 kids were in attendance. Shooting events included a Laser Range (hunting ethics), a Shotgun Range, a Black Powder Range, a BB Gun Range, an Archery Range, and a .22 Rifle Range. A gun safety theme of "ACTT" (Assume it is loaded, Control the muzzle, Trigger finger, & Target and beyond) was immersed into the shooting events.

Other activities included Deer Biology/Wildlife Conservation classes, Radio Telemetry classes, Operation Game Thief Trailer, Llama Packing orientations, Field Dressing/Cape Care classes, and your Cowboy Action Shooting demonstrations.

All guests and volunteers were provided a lunch of bratwurst, hotdogs, chips, cookies, and soft drinks. In addition, all kids were given a badge holder, a M.U.L.E.Y. t-shirt, a grab bag of goodies and a MDF Youth membership.

Again, thank you for your gift and please pass my thanks to the other volunteers and your organization.
