## Pikes Peak MDF Letter



Calhan, CO - The Pikes Peak Chapter of the Mule Deer Foundation held its second official M. U. L. E. Y. event called "M.U.L.E.Y. Kids' Day". The event was conducted at Rocky Mountain Roosters near Calhan, Colorado on May 10th 2014 and was highly successful as the result of the hard work of over 80 volunteers from numerous pro-gun and wildlife conservation organizations. The M.U.L.E.Y. program's mission statement is: To safely introduce youth to shooting sports, ensuring the sports continued growth. The two main tenets of the M.U.L.E.Y. Program are:

- 1) The safe introduction of youth into shooting sports.
- 2) Educating youth on the importance of wildlife conservation.

Almost 427 guests to include 247 kids were in attendance. Shooting events included the Colorado Parks and Wildlife (CPW) Laser Range (hunting ethics), a Pheasants Forever Shotgun Range, a Colorado Springs Muzzle Loader Association Black Powder Range, a Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation BB Gun Range, a Colorado Springs Junior Olympic Archery Development (JOAD) Archery Range, and a 4H Shooting Sports .22 Rifle Range. A gun safety theme of "ACTT" (Assume it is loaded, Control the muzzle, Trigger finger, & Target and beyond) was immersed into the all events.

Other activities included CPW Deer Biology/Wildlife Conservation classes; CPW Radio Telemetry classes; CPW Operation Game Thief Trailer; Wildflower Ridge Llamas Packing orientations; Colorado Shaketails Cowboy Action Shooting demonstrations; Gold Canyon Shooters Cowboy Re-enactment demonstrations; Trout Unlimited fly casting, and fly tying demonstrations; Ducks Unlimited Duck Calling classes; and National Wild Turkey Federation Turkey Calling classes. All guests and volunteers were provided a lunch of bratwurst, hotdogs, chips, cookies, and soft drinks. In addition, all kids were given a badge holder, a M.U.L.E.Y. hat, a M.U.L.E.Y. backpack and a MDF Youth membership.

The Pikes Peak Chapter would like to recognize the following for their generous contributions to the event: Mr. Brett Axton for the use of the Rocky Mountain Roosters facilities, Major Contracting Services for portable toilets, Billy Joe and Sharon Stephenson (B & S Processing) for the hot dogs and bratwursts, and BMAKK Corporation for trash disposal.
